MANDATE

The Indian Agricultural Universities Association (IAUA) is a Registered Society under Registration no. 3498 of 10 November, 1967. It was established in November 1967 with nine agricultural universities as its founder members, viz. PAU, Chandigarh (now Ludhiana); APAU (now ANGRAU), Hyderabad; JNKVV, Jabalpur; UPAU (now GBPUAT), Pantnagar; UAS, Bangalore; KU, Kalyani university (now BCKV, Mohanpur); OUAT, Bhubaneshwar; UU (now MPUAT), Udaipur and IARI, New Delhi.

During this long span there has been phenomenal increase in the number of member universities, especially during the late 90s and onwards. At present the strength of the IAUA membership is 61 including i.e. 54 state agricultural universities, 5 deemed-to-be universities (IARI, IVRI, NDRI, CIFE and SHIATS) and 2 central agricultural universities (CAU, Imphal and BHU, Varanasi). All these are regular members of the Association.

The main objective of the Association is to promote agricultural research, education and extension in the universities and the states, and thereby rural development in the country. It also acts as a bureau of information to facilitate communication, co-ordination and mutual consultation among agricultural universities. The Association also acts as a liaison between member universities and government departments to facilitate communication and expedite the needed action in matters of importance.

All the SAUs and institutions (deemed-to-be universities) and (Central Agricultural Universities) in India, which provide an integrated programme of teaching, research and extension education in agricultural sciences, are qualified to become regular members of the Association.

Vice-Chancellors of member universities constitute the Association's General Body. The General Body meets once a year to decide the agenda for the next convention and other events and also for adoption of its audited accounts of the year and approval of budget estimates for the next financial year, besides the election of the office-bearers for the following calendar year. The Executive Committee of the Association consists of President, Vice-President, Secretary-General, Treasurer and three members. The Executive Committee meets quarterly.

The office of the Association is manned by Executive Secretary, who implements the decisions of General Body and Executive Committee on behalf of the Association. A quarterly newsletter is also being published by the Association since 2000, giving important news, events and achievements by member universities for the information of all the members and others interested. An Annual report is also published documenting all the activities of the year.

The information on events proceedings are published through the host universities, and the recommendations are also included in website (www.iauaindia.org) and circulated to all the VCs of member universities and other main stake holders.

The main source of revenue of the Association is the annual subscription from member universities. The ICAR also provides a nominal grant annually.

EVENTS

1) "Brain storming session on agriculture research and education: Role of SAU/SVU/SHU/SFU- Expectations and responsibilities" held at IARI, New Delhi on 18-05-2013

Recommendations:

- 1. A large gap in the human resource availability and requirement has greatly affected both quality of teaching and research capacities particularly in disciplines of veterinary, dairy, fisheries and other allied fields. It was suggested that educational institutes in these disciplines should increase their intake capacity. Efforts also need to be made to fill up the existing vacant research and teaching positions in various academic institutions on priority.
- 2. Basic science disciplines are being marginalized in SAUs teaching programs. A larger focus in the initial years should be on basic science subjects so that students have a strong academic background.
- 3. Appropriate linkages and communication among IAUA's member universities and with ICAR should be developed specially to address the education system in totality so as to improve skills and knowledge, to reduce inbreeding and to enhance exposure, both at national and international level, of students, teachers, researchers and extension specialists.



- 4. The State universities should initiate sandwich education and research programmes with other universities, ICAR institutes and overseas organizations for providing a fillip to their activities.
- 5. National performance indicators should be developed for evaluation of students, teachers and accreditation of the Universities. These indicators should be integral part of the policy on higher education.
- 6. ICAR should institute a dedicated education promotion fund at least Rs.100 crores to each university during 12th five year plan for strengthening infrastructure and human resource for making state universities internationally competent.
- 7. IAUA should develop a database on various indicators and activities to enlarge its role in participation and be involved in informed opinions.
- 8. Large overlapping in research programs within ICAR institutes and between ICAR institutes and SAUs was a major concern. There was a definite need to avoid this. It was suggested that ICAR institutes should undertake basic research and applied component should be left to SAUs. Linkages between ICAR and State institutions should be developed to ensure avoidance of duplication. More and more state universities should be involved in Network and Platform research programmes.
- 9. The State universities should develop technologies on precision farming, protected cultivation, integrated farming systems for natural resource conservation and making the enterprises economical and sustainable.
- 10. Public-private partnership model should be explored for technology development and their dissemination.

38th Annual VCs Convention of VCCs on "Centre State Relationship in Agriculture University" held at Ranchi during 18-20th December, 2013.

Recommendations:

The following recommendations were finalized after thorough deliberations:

- Implementation of Model Act of ICAR with financial and administrative autonomy on priority.
- Investment plan for SAUs on the basis of 50-50% by the State Government and ICAR for existing establishment and expansion.
- There should be uniformity between SAUs with CAU with respect to retirement age of Scientists/Teachers and Vice-chancellors.
- For smooth running of SAUs, State Governments should sanction and release Annual Grant on yearly basis in the beginning of the financial year.
- There should be provision of handsome Flexi Budget for SAU by State Governments for need-based utilization by the University.
- The responsibility of payment of retirement benefits to KVK employees and AICRP employees lies with SAUs. Accordingly, the Government should provide the fund for the same.
- Climate change project should be started in all Agricultural Universities in a bigway and be initially funded by the Union Government through ICAR.
- ICAR be given statutory power on line of UGC for general Universities for better quality deliverance.

Shri H.Sadananda, Tapasihalli village, P.O. Antharahalli, Doddaballapur taluk, Bangalore Rural district coming under the iurisdiction of Rural Bio -Resource Complex Project, implemented by the UAS, Bangalore, was conferred with Jagjivan Ram Abhinav Kisan Puraskar- 2012 Zonal Award for innovative farming practices on 16 July 2013 at New Delhi.

Shri. Sadananda carried out innovative interventions by growing onion and garlic between rose plants for additional income, utilizing temporary water storage pond for profitable fish production,

judicious use of water and minimizing labour costs. He adopted drip irrigation system or entire farm to make judicious use of water, and used crop and animal residues to produce the required quantity of compost and vermi compost on farm, grew quality colour capsicum in polyhouse, minimized weed growth by providing water near the rooting zone through drips and produced coconuts, fruits (jack, lemon, papaya and pomegranate), drumstick and fodder crops around the fence and on bunds.

Farmer-Scientist Award to innovative farmers

The university became the first in the country in honouring innovative farmers with Farmer-Scientist award during its convocation from 2010-11 onwards. The Award consists of a citation and cash prize of Rs 50,000. During 2012-13, 2 innovative farmers, viz. Shri Devendrappa S. Balotagi of K. Gonal village of Koppal district, and Shri Shanabasappa Patil, Halsultanpur village of Gulbarga district were honoured with this award during 3rd Convocation held on 30-3-2013. Shri Devendrappa Balotagi adopted silvi-horti-agriculture farming systems, in which a variety of fruit trees, timber, sandalwood are grown along with field crops.

He is responsible for establishing fruit growers association and cold storage in Kustagi taluk of Koppal district. Shri Sharabasappa Patil, an ITI (Electrical) Diploma holder, who is involved in farming innovated several low cost equipments such as solar electrical fences, nipping instrument in redgram, tap irrigation with auto stop system for horticultural crops etc. He developed his farm in such a way that it can be used as Farmers' Field School. By considering these innovative ideas in agriculture, UAS, Raichur has honoured them with Farmer-Scientist award.
